

What is PEI?

The Federal Judicial Center's Professional Education Institute (PEI) is a resource for court staff seeking to improve their leadership and management skills. PEI enhances staff development by identifying key leadership practices and providing curricula including in-person, television, and web-based programs and other materials to help staff learn and hone those practices. PEI includes separate tracks for staff in court unit executive offices (including staff attorneys and librarians) and probation and pretrial services offices. The PEI web portal is the entry to a virtual campus where staff can access additional information as well as professional development tools to help pinpoint learning needs and create custom learning plans.

Why PEI?

For the court unit, PEI supports

- development and retention of competent, motivated staff
- assessment of training needs
- workplace and succession planning

For the individual user, PEI provides

- a clear outline of leadership practices staff need to know to excel and to advance their careers
- tools to identify specific educational needs, and access to resources to help meet those needs
- recommendations for programs, materials, and on-the-job training activities to pursue professional development
- flexibility to use site resources individually or with a supervisor's guidance

Curricula
